# Parents' News

Dear Parents:

Mayflower Primary School has high expectations for your child's learning and we know that you also have many hopes and dreams for your child's success in school and beyond.

To make sure those hopes and dreams are realised, I want to request your commitment to making sure your child attends school every day possible this year. The evidence is clear: children with good attendance are more likely to be successful in school. High attendance rates are linked to high student achievement and regular school attendance from nursery onwards is essential to successful learning.

Every day counts. Missing school even 10% of the time has a significant negative impact on achievement as children progress through school.

Good attendance starts early. Research has shown that the attendance habits established early have lasting effects on students throughout their education: children with high attendance in the early years continue to have good attendance throughout; and students with low attendance in the early years are more likely to have low attendance—and lower academic performance.

Both you and your child play a big part in this. By ensuring your child attends on time and everyday, you are teaching your child good practice, which in time will stand them in good stead when they are grown ups themselves and in the workplace rather than school.

As stated in the Education Act 1996 'If any child of compulsory school age who is a registered pupil at a school fails to attend regularly at the school, his/her parent is guilty of an offence.'

Please remember we are here to support parents with attendance.

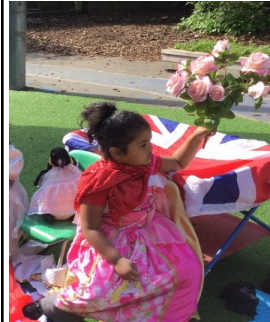
