The Training Hub are delighted to invite all Health and Care workforce to this webinar focused on understanding Somali Cultural Sensitivities. The event will have input from local and external speakers and present the audience with an opportunity to reflect on health inequality and our Somali population.

The event aims to:

- Engage with local workforce across the borough in an inter-disciplinary manner to share learning from the micro-study done on Somali patients in Tower hamlets and North East London researched by Dr Prof Lewis (Associate Professor, LSE) and Dr Farah Bede (local GP) commissioned by the British Academy looking at the affect the first wave of the pandemic had on Somali's living in the east end
- Discuss Somali Cultural sensitivities from the Somali GP perspective and also from the point
 of view of engagement with services such as mental health, women's health and domestic
 violence.
- Include presentation of case studies of patients to give some insight into health seeking behaviours from Somali patients to give snapshot of engagement with services.
- Look at the evidence bases from secondary literature on existing health and inequalities and how this was compounded during the pandemic
